Also, all students take a course on Environment studies in their first year which gives them insight into environment acts, wildlife protection act, forest act, global environmental concerns etc.

In addition to this many regular programs are conducted by institute to educate women about their rights. Also seminars and workshops are conducted on days of national importance on various rights, duties and responsibilities of citizen. Seminars on topics like Right to Information, Sexual Harassment, and Gender Equity are conducted periodically.

The students of SDDC of all branches study constitution of India as a subject which sensitizes the students about constitutional obligations. Every year Republic Day is celebrated on 26th Jan by organizing activities highlighting the importance of Indian Constitution. Independence Day is also celebrated every year to highlight struggle of freedom and importance of Indian constitution
